ODDS AND ENDS HAT ON TWO NEEDLES

NOTE: We provide hats locally and globally, in warm climates and cold. This gives you many yarn options -cotton, blends, acrylic and wool.

This design creates a hat that will fit different ages by folding up the bottom edge as much as desired. It is knit flat on two needles, then seamed.

Finished size: This will vary with the yarn and needles used.

Gauge: 4 to 5 sts to the inch

Materials:

Needles: Size 8 or 9

Yarn: Soft, washable worsted weight in three colors.

Tapestry or varn needle for finishing

Directions:

Cast on 68 (72) stitches. For a smaller or larger hat, decrease or increase the number of stitches in multiples of 4.

Every Row *Knit 2, purl 2^* to end of row. Continue until the hat measures 8 to 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ (10 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 11) inches. adding stripes in two other colors as desired.

Begin decreasing: This method of decreasing keeps the ribbed pattern throughout. The decreasing rows should be the right side of the cap.

Row 1: (decreasing row) *Knit 2tog, Purl 2* repeat to end of row 51, (54) sts remaining

Row 2: *Knit 2, Purl 1* repeat to end of row

Row 3: (decreasing row) \bar{K} 1 Purl 2 tog* repeat to end of row 34, (36) sts remaining

Row 4: *Knit 1, Purl 1* repeat to end of row

Row 5: (decreasing row) *Knit 2tog * repeat to end of row 17 (18) sts remaining

Row 6: Purl

Row: (decreasing row) *Knit 2tog * repeat to last stitch, K1 (repeat to end of row) 9 (9) sts remaining

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail (about 18 inches).

Finishing:

With yarn needle, pull yarn through remaining stitches and fasten securely, then turn hat inside-out and stitch the seam. Add a tassel or pompom if desired.

Bless your completed project with a hug and your love. It will provide comfort, healing, and hope for the recipient.
